Needed to get another Chevy but one that was more of a classic rather than antique so it would have an automatic transmission. Since i sold my 32, i have watched Hemmings and the G&D to see what is for sale each month. I check on both websites to see what is for sale that i might like even before the magazines came to my mailbox.

So when the Nov issue of the G&D was on the website on October 28th i see this 1962 Chevy II Nova 400 convertible for sale in Indiana by a VCCA member. It was red on red, i kind of liked it but never had thought of a convertible but more a hardtop. After a day i kept on thinking about this car so on the 30th I called the owner and talked about the car. It was really nice but the restoration was 30 years old so it was not going to be a show car for points but i was not really looking for that. We talked twice for over an hour about the car and what had been done and the miles on it since the restoration and then finally we agreed on a price as i assured him it would have a great home in a heated garage for the rest of my life and maybe even get some new items on it if i see some that were not as pristine as i wanted but it would never be made into a restomod.
